### **The Spanish American war of 1898**

1898.- Feb 16 – New York Journal (evening edition) – 417 sailors slaughtered by the explosion on the Maine.

\*1898.- Feb 17 – New York Tribune – Destruction of the Maine. Two hundred and fifty eight gallant men lost with the battle ship. Cause of the explosion still a mystery.

\*1898.- Feb 17 – New York Journal – Destruction of the war ship Maine was the work of an enemy.

1898.- Apr 14 – New York Journal – We have got to fight!. Must declare war.

1898.- Apr 20 – New York Journal – Ultimatum to Spain : Evacuate Cuba; Answer yes or no within 48 hours. Spain’s answer is No!. Sagasta to the Cortes!. No concession; Fight to the end.

1898.- Apr 22 – New York Journal – War fleet stripped for battle is off to Cuba!. Capture of Havana its object.

1898.- Apr 22 – The Boston Herald – First shot. Gunboat Nashville captures a Spanish Steamer.

1898.- Apr 22 – The Schenectady Daily Union – One shot. Squadron is now at Havana. The blockade of Cuban Ports has begun. Yankee got the Spaniard.

1898.- Apr 27 – Albany Evening Journal – On to Havana!. Insurgents will start after we have equipped them with armas, ammunitions and Supplies.

1898.- Apr 30 – The New York Times – Fleet now due at Manila. A naval battle imminent. Cuba to be invaded early next week.

1898.- May 2 – New York Journal – Another Battle

1898.- May 2 – The Bulletin, San Francisco – Manila Surrenders. Dewey is Monarch.

\*1898.- May 2 – New York Journal – Victory!. Spanish fleet in the Philippines destroyed. All their ships burned, blown up and sank. The Maine is avenged. (2)

\*1898.- May 2 – The World, New York – Dewey smashes Spain’s fleet. Great Naval Battle between Asiatic Squadron and Spanish warships off Manila. Three of the best Spanish vessels wiped out of existence.

1898.- May 3 – New York Tribune – Dewey send an ultimatum. Madrid under martial law.

1898.- May 4 – The Times-Union, Albany – Riots begin in Spain. Mobs attacked a railroad stations and burnt several stations.

1898.- May 17 – New York Tribune – Strategy in the Caribbean. American and Spanish fleets manoeuvre for advantage position. No naval battle

expected for several days. Department of the Pacific created. Preparing for the Philippine expedition and the invasion of Cuba. The crisis in Madrid.

1898.- May 22 – The Sunday Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – Last straw of Spain. Our Fleet at Santiago. If we take Puerto Rico, old Spain will be crippled.

1898.- May 23 – The Daily Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – More ships coming. Spain will send another fleet to the West Indies. Admiral Cervera's fleet has certainly left Santiago.

1898.- May 24 – The Daily Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – Reinforce Cervera. Sampson has him. The Spanish Admiral Bottled up in Santiago de Cuba. Everybody is at sea. No news from our fleets or information regarding Spaniards.

1898.- May 25 – The Daily Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – Cervera corked up?. Hunting for Spaniards. Still at Santiago. Spaniards are waiting to be bottle up by Americans.

1898.- May 26 – The Daily Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – Cervera is caught. Puerto Rico will be taken.

1898.- May 26 – Albany Evening Journal – The richest prize of all. Spain's auxiliary cruiser Panama captured by the little mangrove with only two six-pounders and thirteen men.

1898.- May 27 – The Daily Pioneer Press, Saint Paul -- Venture of Vessels. Five of commodores Schley's warships enter Cienfuegos harbour. Schley is at Santiago. Spaniards want peace.

1898.- May 28 – The Daily Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – Ship and Spyglass. Where is Cervera?. Cadiz fleet. Blanco confirms it. Reports of admiral Cervera's plight receive confirmation.

1898.- May 29 – The Sunday Pioneer Press, Saint Paul – Cienfuegos to be crushed. First Cuban city to be hammered into submission

1898.- Jun 6 – San Francisco Chronicle – Rumors of a naval battle at Cape Haytien. Americans said to have engaged a mysterious Spanish fleet.

1898.- Jun 18 – San Francisco Chronicle – Manila at the mercy of the insurgent troops. Scenes in Manila Bay during and after the Battle won by Dewey. Cadiz fleet puts to sea. Advance of insurgents.

1898.- Jun 28 – New York Journal – Anxious to fight!

1898.- July 4 – The Minneapolis Journal – Santiago's Day of Doom is at Hand. General Linares has refused to surrender. Cervera prisoner. His whole fleet gone.

1898.- Jul 7 – La Correspondencia de España, Madrid – La Guerra

1898.- Jul 8 – The Pittsburg Post – Spanish Cabinet discusses peace

1898.- Jul 8 – Heraldo de Madrid – De La Habana. La Habana, de luto.

1898.- July 9 – The Nebraska State Journal, Lincoln – The truce ends. Signs of peace. Spain the first to move.

1898.- July 10 – The Daily Inter Ocean, Chicago – Repulse de foe. Spaniards are defeated in night attacks upon American lines at Manila. Peace in doubt. Spain seems to be trying to argue about the conditions imposed. War may continue. Spain must yield.

1898.- July 10 – The Sunday State Journal, Lincoln – Fight or yield. No half way measures permitted at Santiago.

1898.- July 11 – The Nebraska State Journal – Lincoln – Surrender or die. Spanish have little chance if fight begins.

1898.- Jul 12 – La Correspondencia de España, Madrid – La Guerra. El bombardeo de Santiago de Cuba.

1898.- July 12 – The Nebraska State Journal – Lincoln – The Terms of Peace. Demand of United States declared impossible. Madrid claims knowledge.

1898.- Aug 3 – The Pittsburg Post – Spain Ends the War. Terms of peace dictated by President McKinley are accepted by the Madrid Government.

1898.- Aug 9 – The New York Tribune – Spain's reply arrives. Ambassador Cambón will deliver it today.

1898.- Aug 11 – The Daily Inter Ocean – Chicago – Reports a fight. Captain General Macias Cables the advance of the American Army. Troops at Aibonito. The Spanish officer says that fighting has occurred at that point. Battle at Guanami. We want Manila.

1898.- Aug 12 – The Daily Inter Ocean – Chicago – War is at an end. Spain has authorised Cambón to Sign the American Terms of Peace. Yields all points.
